Due to staff turnover, capacity issues, and access to Sage we were unable to submit in a timely manner.

ARCH now performs drawdowns on a monthly basis. Drawdowns were delayed throughout 2021 due to staffing turnover, lack of capacity, and lack of access to eLOCCS until June of 2021. Drawdowns are now current for Healing Haven and HUD CM and are now being entered into eLOCCS by the 15th of every month. Previous leadership had not made timely drawdowns for Healing Haven. ARCH has built new processes around our grants to avoid late draws occurring in the future. We have a hired a Grant Procurement Manager with sole responsibility of managing our grants and drawdowns from eLOCCS. We separated our Human Resources and Finance Departments. We now have a Human Resources Director and a Finance Director who supervises the Grant Procurement Manager, a Procurement Specialist, and a Medicaid Procurement Specialist. We also have a board member with eLOCCS login information who is monitoring drawdowns.

ARCH Roanoke requests a renewal for our 34 single and family units of permanent supportive housing for the chronically homeless population in the Roanoke Valley. ARCH is requesting funding for leasing; supportive services for case management; operating costs for utilities, damages, and insurance for leased structures; and administrative costs. ARCH utilizes a Housing First approach in that participants do not have to have income or length of sobriety to enter housing. By removing these barriers, ARCH Roanoke continues to house people quickly to aid in their stabilization. ARCH is an active participant at the bi-monthly By Name List Committee meetings, where all client referrals for this project are obtained. ARCH Roanoke currently has a Housing Case Manager who is a certified peer recovery support specialist. She has developed critical skills and knowledge in serving challenging populations over the last two years in regard to helping participants maintain housing. Along with case management services, she offers an open peer recovery support group once a week to participants in this project who need added mental health and or drug and alcohol addiction support. ARCH utilizes two therapeutic modalities: Stages of Change and Person Centered Care to guide our work and encourage clients to live the best and healthiest life possible. Participants receive services in their home and in the community and are referred to outside agencies when needed. ARCH continuously work towards three main outcomes: participants will remain housed after one year; participants will maintain or increase their income; and participants will improve their self-sufficiency during their time in the program. ARCH has partnered with area landlords to provide the physical housing and property management and ARCH has entered into a master lease with each landlord and sublease to program participants, which includes an agreement for maintaining services in alignment with Housing First principles.
